Naseby Parish Council currently has a vacancy for a member of the public to become a Parish Councillor

If you feel you would like to get involved in making decisions about your local community, local issues and make a significant contribution to the area in which you live or work, then this is the position for you!



Do you have an interest in your local community, environment, transport, amenities, planning and housing issues, community events, anti-social behaviour, and policing, as well as your local government finances and want to make a difference then please apply!



- You must be aged 18 years and over, eligible to vote and have lived or worked in the parish of Naseby for 12 months or more, or within 3 miles of the parish boundary.
- Any elector can identify a potential councillor and nominate candidates for election and have the right to elect a councillor who represents their interests.
- Unless ten electors of the Parish give written notice to the Proper Officer of West Northants Council (Electoral Services, West Northamptonshire Council, Council Offices, Lodge Road, Daventry, NN11 4FP) requesting an election to fill this vacancy, the Parish Council will fill the vacancy by co-option at its next available meeting, or by election if the vacancy falls within an election year.



# WHIPPING CROSS

Proposed Repairs to the Grade II Whipping Cross in Naseby

Work is due to start on the repairs as the newsletter goes to press.



The Grade II Listed Whipping Cross was constructed during the 15th century out of limestone and comprises a round shaft set into a square plinth. It is thought to have been from the old market cross which dates to circa 1203 or 1204 when Roger de Lacey secured for his newly acquired manor a charter granting Naseby a weekly market.

The plinth is probably circa 1993 and is in a limestone. A number of these stones have started to delaminate and are crumbling. The bedding mortar is a form of Engineered Cementitious Composite (ECC) and this appears to be a contributory factor in causing the lower stones to fail.

The delaminated stones from the top two courses of the Whipping Cross will be removed and replaced

with an approved Clipsham Top bed limestone. This will involve twelve or thirteen new stones being provided.

The remedial work requires listed building approval by the local planning authority, and this was granted in the summer of last year. The proposed replacement stone (Clipsham) being approved in early March this year, now means the works can go ahead.

The works are likely to take around two weeks to complete and are being carried out by David Sleight Conservation (<a href="http://www.sleightconservation.co.uk">http://www.sleightconservation.co.uk</a>) David is highly experienced and a member of the Institute of Historic Building

Conservation (IHBC).



## **GYM EQUIPMENT**

#### An outdoor gym for Naseby?

When travelling through some of our local villages, such as Great Brington, Crick and Overstone, you may have noticed the growing popularity of outdoor gyms. Playing fields and children's play areas are being supplemented with a variety of exercise equipment suitable for use by adults of all ages and fitness levels.

A couple of examples are shown in the photographs below. The first, from Crick, shows two versions of a cross-trainer, equipment for upper body training and a piece of kit whose use I couldn't fathom.

The second shows a rowing machine at Great Brington: one piece from a line of eight offering exercises for all body parts while watching the sun rise.

The Parish Council would be interested in the views of villagers as to whether we should raise funds in order to install an outdoor gym on the Naseby playing fields. The idea has the suport of the Village Hall, and if we were to go ahead with such a project the equipment would likely be located in the corner of the field to the right of the car park.

### **ALL SAINTS CHURCH NEWS**

Dear Friends,

We seem to be moving from one horrifying challenge to another: no sooner do we feel as though we have got on top of Coronavirus, than we find ourselves witnessing the horror or war in Ukraine. What an utter tragedy the conflict is, and how we long to help those caught up in it. Much has been done to send vital medical supplies, warm clothes, babyfood and equipment, etc.; and now, if we are in a position to, we can offer space in our homes to those who have had to flee their own homes and homeland. How little it seems in the face of such distress and violence, yet how valuable to those who need it. In Ukraine, we have seen how important Christianity is there, and how much people's faith has given them strength and hope. Here, in Naseby, the prayer vigil held at All Saints' was an opportunity to come together in solidarity with those caught up in the war, and to offer with them our hopes and prayers for peace. It is my hope that by the time you read this progress towards peace will have been made.

As we approach Easter, alongside our fellow Christians in Ukraine and across the world, the familiar events of Holy Week and Good Friday demonstrate the deadly cost of fearful lies and political expediency. It could be, though, that some or many of you reading this aren't familiar with those events, don't know what Easter is all about - don't know what is not just God's story, but your story.

You may have many questions, and that is a good thing! If that is the case, ask me, or someone you know who is a Christian, and we'll be delighted to share our faith, to describe the peace and joy it gives us, even in times of difficulty. Or come and join us for our worship, be welcomed as a fellow member of God's family, and hear the story for yourself – if you don't know already, find out what that cross on the hot-cross bun is all about, and the new life it points to.

This year, Easter Day, when we celebrate new life and the defeat of death, falls on 17<sup>th</sup> April, and there will be a special festive service at 9.30am: we would love to see you. Of course, we would love to see you at All Saints' at any time, but if a worship service is a step too far, what about coming along to one of the informal church events in Naseby or one of its sister parishes – Clipston, Haselbech, Kelmarsh, Marston Trussell, Sibbertoft or Welford? You will find details of all sorts of things going on, all of which you are invited to.

There is much happening across the parishes – not least over the Platinum Jubilee weekend.

## 59 / 60 BUS SERVICE UPDATE

Good News! The continuation of the bus service through Naseby has been confirmed up to the end of August 2022, and there is optimism that it will continue through to the end of March 2023. The service allows shopping trips to Market Harborough on Tuesdays and Fridays via the 59 bus and to Northampton on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays via the 60 bus.

Over recent years the 59/60 buses have only continued due to part funding by parishes along the routes and Naseby has offered £1,604 for 2022/23, the same amount as for 2021/22.

The way that Government transport grants in England is awarded is changing radically this year, and the amount awarded to West Northamptonshire Council (WNC) will not be known until later in 2022.

The new system has required the production of a Bus Service Improvement Plan which was submitted by WNC in October 2021, followed by the Council entering into Enhanced Partnerships with bus operators by the end of April 2022. The amount of Government grant awarded will not be known until this process is completed, but WNC's budget does include a small amount for transport which will allow funding until the end of August.

It is anticipated that once Government grant awards to WNC are known, the 59/60 services will continue until the end of March 2023.



## REPORTING HIGHWAY FAULTS



It is now simple to report highway faults yourself online using FixMyStreet (<a href="https://FixMyStreet.com">https://FixMyStreet.com</a>). Examples would be potholes, damaged street signs, missing or damaged kerbs etc.

The on-screen instructions are reasonably easy to follow. Insertion of a post code brings up a map of the location and a list of reports by other people indicated by yellow circles on the map. The area of map can be moved around and enlarged to identify the precise spot of interest where you can place a new fault marker.

For example, to report a pothole click 'Roads' on the list of faults and a subcategory appears on which 'potholes / highway condition' should be clicked. A photo can be added which shows the pothole (close up and wide view if possible).

On the next screen a brief description should be inserted. You do not need to use a password but should provide an email address. Do NOT click the small box If you do not wish your name to be publicly attached to your report.

When you have submitted the report to FixMyStreet you will receive an email with a copy of what you have input. If you are happy you are requested to confirm that you wish it to be submitted to Northamptonshire Highways.

You will then receive emails direct from Northamptonshire Highways logging the report and in due course indicating what action they intend.


Please note that in Naseby, streetlighting is the responsibility of the Parish Council and faults should be reported to the Clerk or any Parish Councillor.

## VILLAGE HALL DEFIBRILLATOR

Naseby Football Club has been awarded a grant of £1,700 by KWCB, the Kelmarsh Wind Community Benefit CIO, to provide a public defibrillator at the village hall. This will benefit the football club and all residents together with users of the hall, sports court, play area and field.

It is to be installed on the exterior wall of the hall and will be maintained and re-supplied by the Parish Council in tandem with the existing defibrillator at the Methodist Chapel.

A defibrillator training session will be arranged once the installation is completed.




## **KELMARSH WIND FARM TRUSTEE CHANGES**

Kelmarsh Wind Community Benefit (KWCB) is the charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) associated with the Kelmarsh Wind Farm which is responsible for the distribution of grants to the 4 villages which benefit from the wind farm.

There are 8 trustees with 2 from each of the villages of Naseby, Clipston, Kelmarsh and Haselbech who each serve terms of 3 years. Trustees are appointed by their respective Parish Councils, but they cannot vote on grant applications from their own village. They can however offer invaluable advice on potential new applications.

One of Naseby's trustees, Scott Westaway is stepping down and he is being replaced by Stephen Davies who will serve for a period of 3 years. Our other trustee is Richard Nicholson who was appointed in 2020.

The Parish Council thanks Scott for his considerable work over a prolonged period. He was one of the founding wind farm trust representatives in 2016 who together with Paul Kelly were heavily involved in the lengthy negotiations with the wind farm owners and the Charity Commissioners, culminating in the CIO being able to consider its first grant awards in early 2019.

# **FUNDRAISING!**

# 66 Year old from Naseby, prepares to walk over 2000 kilometers for Prostate Cancer UK

Kemal Chetitah, a 66-year-old man from Naseby is walking 2040 kilometers from Canterbury to Rome to raise money for leading men's health charity, Prostate Cancer UK. Kemal has form for taking on walking challenges and you may have seen him training on the roads around Northamptonshire in preparation for this challenge.

Kemal is hoping to raise over £8000 by completing the walk, leaving Canterbury on 16<sup>th</sup> May, passing through five countries and three major mountain ranges all within 80 days. Starting at Canterbury Cathedral, he will walk the North Downs Way to Dover, before setting sail for France. Once there he will cross the undulating plains of Northern France with their war cemeteries & poppy fields, through to the mountains of Jura and into Switzerland, crossing the Alps at the Great St Bernard Pass. After the Alps, his route winds its way through the wetlands of the River Po and its tributaries, then crosses the Apennines, the main mountain range of Italy to the Mediterranean coast and the Tuscan countryside, finishing in Lazio at the Vatican and St. Peters in Rome. Kemal punishing schedule should mean he arrives in Rome by the 4<sup>th</sup>August this year, with all profits going to join the fight to help save men's lives.

Kemal was inspired to take on the challenge for Prostate Cancer UK in honor of his father & brother who have both suffered from the disease. Currently one man dies every 45 minutes from prostate cancer in the UK. That's more than 11,500 men a year and by 2030, prostate cancer is set to become the most commonly diagnosed cancer of all in the UK

Lots of exciting things have been happening at Naseby C of E since our last Parish newsletter entry.

**Staffing;** Firstly, it has been wonderful to welcome two new members of staff; Mrs. Linyard & Mrs. Markham, who are both full time Teaching Assistants.

**Sport;** In sporting success; we entered a Basketball competition between 'Pacesetter schools', one team came third and the other team won the tournament! We also won a Quickstix Hockey Competition and came 2<sup>nd</sup> in a tag Rugby tournament.

NSA; Thanks to the fundraising efforts of our fantastic parent's association, we have been able to purchase new musical instruments for the whole school and we are greatly looking forward to making some music! On that note! Busy Badgers class (Years 3 & 4) have been enjoying weekly visits from Northamptonshire Music and Performing Arts Trust, learning the 'recorder' throughout Spring Term. Next term the NSA are going to begin helping the school fundraise for an ICT Learning Suite and to help keep our wonderful library bus maintained.

Christian Distinctiveness; At the beginning of Spring Term each class enjoyed a 'Forest Church' in our forest area, led by Father Kris on Epiphany. We learned about the Christian Epiphanytide tradition of 'chalking the door' to bless our classrooms, then we enjoyed a trail around the school grounds to learn about the journey of Caspar, Melchoir, and Balthasar. Father Kris ended with Bob Hartman's interactive story of the Three Wise Men.

The school Governors and I have enjoyed visits from Peterborough Diocese and the Christian Ethos Team took part in the children Collective Worship conference with over 25 other schools. The Christian Ethos Team are made up of children from years 3-6 who meet over a lunchtime each week to reflect, pray and plan a Collective Worship to deliver to the school.

This term we invited Daisy from The Leprosy Mission who told us about their work and how they help those affected in other countries.
