Naseby Parish Council currently has a vacancy for a member of the public to become a Parish Councillor

If you feel you would like to get involved in making decisions about your local community, local issues and make a significant contribution to the area in which you live or work, then this is the position for you!



Do you have an interest in your local community, environment, transport, amenities, planning and housing issues, community events, anti-social behaviour, and policing, as well as your local government finances and want to make a difference then please apply!



- You must be aged 18 years and over, eligible to vote and have lived or worked in the parish of Naseby for 12 months or more, or within 3 miles of the parish boundary.
- Any elector can identify a potential councillor and nominate candidates for election and have the right to elect a councillor who represents their interests.
- Unless ten electors of the Parish give written notice to the Proper Officer of West Northants Council (Electoral Services, West Northamptonshire Council, Council Offices, Lodge Road, Daventry, NN11 4FP) requesting an election to fill this vacancy, the Parish Council will fill the vacancy by co-optation at its next available meeting, or by election if the vacancy falls within an election year.

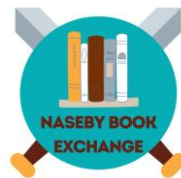

SPEED DISPLAY SIGN VOLUNTEER REQUIRED

Dear Friends,

ALL SAINTS CHURCH WALL - HELP NEEDED!

The masonry boundary wall facing the village shop is in need of extensive repair and church funds are not adequate to cover the work. Volunteers are urgently needed to help raise additional funding.

All Saints Church is a historic building and even to the non-religious it is part of the appeal of living in Naseby. It's our church where we can get christened, married, and finally buried.

The costs of repairs are in the £30,000 to £40,000 range and currently only around £10,000 of church funding is available. The longer the repairs are left the more extensive they will become.

Fundraising was stopped by the pandemic and the Open Gardens event has not taken place for 3 years.

In 2010 repairs to overcome water damage to one of the church's internal walls were urgently required and a small group of villagers formed the Naseby Church Restoration Committee. It raised funds and assisted with grant applications and securing donations. A total of £135,000 was secured and the repairs were successfully carried out.

Please consider if you can help. You do not need to be a member of the congregation but just be willing to give some time to raise funds or organise events such as open gardens, bridge competitions, sponsored walks, or anything that else that could help raise funds.

It is intended to hold a village meeting to discuss the wall repairs at the church on Tuesday 1st November at 7.30pm.

DACT VOLUNTEER DRIVERS NEEDED



Urgent appeal for volunteer drivers in our community - volunteer numbers have HALVED since the pandemic. Please help if you can! Daventry Area Community Transport (DACT) provide a community transport service for elderly and vulnerable people to get them to and from their medical and wellbeing related appointments. The door-to-door service is a crucial lifeline for those who are unable to access suitable public transport. It also enables people to maintain independence in their own homes and reduce their reliance on family, friends, and neighbours for lifts. DACT also operates a free home-to-town transport service each Friday for over 65s in Daventry. The Dial-A-Ride scheme provides a friendly, flexible, and helpful service to elderly and vulnerable people who would otherwise be isolated and unable to independently access shops and other activities in the town centre. For many it is their only trip out of the house each week. Local volunteer drivers are crucial to the continued operation of this much needed service. DACT minibuses are also used for DACT Days out, a programme offering a wide range of day trips to museums, stately homes, pub lunches, the seaside, and other places of interest. These popular trips are crucial in helping combat loneliness and isolation and enable the elderly and vulnerable to make new friends and have a fun day out. DACT also hire the minibuses out for ad hoc bookings by affiliated groups from around the area and drivers are often needed for these bookings too.

If you are recently retired, work part-time or from home, volunteering for DACT as a driver would be a great way to help in your community. Drivers are needed 7 days a week and at weekends. A DBS is required, and drivers are paid mileage or an allowance for each journey made. All journeys are booked in accordance with the volunteer's availability on a weekly basis, so whatever time you can give, whether a few hours or several days a week, will make a difference. All minibus drivers must complete MiDAS (Minibus Driver Awareness Scheme) training which DACT provide inhouse. VILLAGE HALL AND RECREATION GROUND NEWS



The inside of the hall will look a bit different next time you go in! In an effort to reduce our electricity usage and reduce our carbon footprint, and, after consultation with you all, we applied for various grants in order to raise sufficient funds to install a new style of heating – air to air heat pump – and to install a suspended ceiling.

Our thanks go to West Northamptonshire Council, Market Harborough Building Society and Naseby Parish Council for their generous grant donations, without which this could not have happened.

An application is currently going through West Northants Council for the Hall to become a licensed premises for the sale of alcohol. Without this, we are subject to a limit on the number of events where hirers can apply for a temporary licence, and we hit this limit halfway through the year.

On the sports court, the goals have now been repaired – with thanks to Geoff Capell – and have been repaired in such a way that they can be removed to allow temporary vehicular access.

There are currently no exercise classes in the hall, so if you, or someone you know, is looking for a venue to put on any sort of class please get in touch. We can offer a special rate for a 6-week trial.



We do, however, have plenty of dog classes! For more information contact Jo on 07542 739219 for ring craft training on a Tuesday evening or Nicky on 07775 732000 for the Flying Pup-stars training course on a Wednesday evening.

And, if it's lung exercise you're after, contact Brian Packham on 07713 106926 for information on the Naseby Village Wind Band who rehearse on Thursday evenings.

Finally, Con Ryan, who has been the Village Hall Booking Clerk, has decided to step down. Our thanks go to Con for his help over the past few years. This does mean that we are therefore looking for a volunteer to take on this role! A computer is essential as we use a specific programme, but hirers make their own bookings online – the role is very much of a monitoring nature.

Besides a booking clerk, the Management Team is in need of more members. It is not necessary to become a Trustee of the Village Hall, but as we are trying to make full use of the hall facilities throughout the year, to have more voices in the discussions and hands to help, would make things run even more smoothly.

REPORTING HIGHWAY FAULTS

It is now simple to report highway faults yourself online using FixMyStreet (<https://FixMyStreet.com>). Examples would be potholes, damaged street signs, missing or damaged kerbs etc.

The on-screen instructions are reasonably easy to follow. Insertion of a post code brings up a map of the location and a list of reports by other people indicated by yellow circles on the map. The area of map can be moved around and enlarged to identify the precise spot of interest where you can place a new fault marker.

For example, to report a pothole click 'Roads' on the list of faults and a subcategory appears on which 'potholes / highway condition' should be clicked. A photo can be added which shows the pothole (close up and wide view if possible).

On the next screen a brief description should be inserted. You do not need to use a password but should provide an email address. Do NOT click the small box if you do not wish your name to be publicly attached to your report.

When you have submitted the report to FixMyStreet you will receive an email with a copy of what you have input. If you are happy you are requested to confirm that you wish it to be submitted to Northamptonshire Highways.

You will then receive emails direct from Northamptonshire Highways logging the report and in due course indicating what action they intend.

Please note that in Naseby, streetlighting is the responsibility of the Parish Council and faults should be reported to the Clerk or any Parish Councillor.



HOPPER BUS

In addition to the 59/ 60 buses which provides shopping trips to Market Harborough on Tuesday and Friday and to Northampton on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday, a 14 seat Hopper Bus is now operating from Naseby and other villages. This has proved popular during its pilot period and funding has now been secured for the next year.

New trip destinations have been added to the original route to the Aldi store at Moulton via Brixworth and now includes a trip to the Rushton Lakes Shopping centre.

The bus currently operates on Mondays, but seats must be booked in advance. Bus passes can be used.

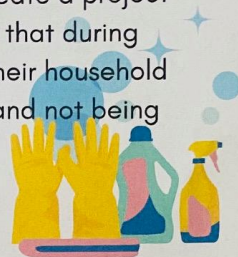

We have received a small amount of funding to create a project around a locally identified need. For those people that during Covid-19 have really struggled to keep on top of their household cleaning. This has left them feeling overwhelmed and not being able to move forward.



Clean-Up Project Outline

- Our project worker will do a home visit & risk assessment
- Each person will receive One-to-One support setting out what we can accomplish together in a one off cleaning/organising session
- A bespoke action plan will be produced for the person to keep laying out what they can do themselves moving forward
- Volunteers and Project worker will carry out a one off clean/organise to help make an impact and get the person back on track.
- Happy@Home will give each person support in finding a cleaner if that is what is needed
- Signposting or extra support etc will also be available (e.g befriending, New Street Centre Activities)

Referrals we are not equipped for:

This project is **not a regular cleaning service** - although we may be able to carry out 2 sessions for people that really need it we are not able to offer regular cleans. We will help people who would like a regular cleaner to find someone who has space and the day/time that suits where we can.

This project is **not for people with hoarding difficulties**. We think these people need specialist help and that is not what we are.

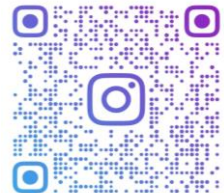
