OUTDOOR GYM UPDATE

I am pleased to be able to report that the Kelmarsh Windfarm Community Benefit Trust has awarded £7,000 to the scheme to set up an outdoor gym on the Village Hall playing field. This donation goes a significant way to raising the funds needed. I'm very grateful to the Trust for the donation.

An application has been made to the National Lottery's community fund for the remaining £10,000. The outcome is expected later in the new year.





NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN - UNDERWAY!

The preparation of a Naseby Neighbourhood Development Plan is underway!

Over 50 people attended a public meeting held in the Methodist Chapel on the 19th of September. The guest speaker, Gary Kirk from local planning consultants Yourlocale, explained what a Neighbourhood Plan is and its importance to Naseby in being able to have control over the type, amount, and location of future development. This is particularly important in light of West Northamptonshire Council's programme to adopt a new Local Plan in 2026 which will replace the current Daventry Local Plan which was originally envisaged to last until 2029.

Naseby Neighbourhood Plan

Bringing the Community Together

At the meeting, residents were invited to join a steering committee and become actively involved in the preparation of the Neighbourhood Plan and a number did just that!

The initial meeting of the Neighbourhood Plan Policy Advisory Committee took place on Monday October 23rd October and was attended by 20 residents plus Gary Kirk of Yourlocale, who has been appointed as a consultant advisor engaged by the Parish Council.

The initial steering committee meeting was chaired by Stephen Davies, Vice Chairman of the Parish Council, but Mark Clement agreed to chair future meetings which will be held approximately every 6 weeks in the Chapel. The next meeting will be on Monday 4th December at 7.00pm.

The overall preparation programme for our neighbourhood plan through to its adoption by West Northants Council, will take about two years but the main work by residents should be completed in the first year. Activities will include circulating a questionnaire to all properties, organising two open days, small groups of residents working on different themes such as housing, landscape and important views, historic areas requiring protection etc., and writing the neighbourhood plan policies and documents.

The plan prepared by Naseby will be subject to consultation by a whole range of stakeholders and vetting by an independent expert appointed by West Northants Council to ensure it complies with both the Local Plan and National planning guidance.

The final action will be for the plan to be subject to a referendum of Naseby residents who are registered to vote. A simple majority is necessary for the plan to be approved (50% of votes cast + 1).

Once adopted by West Northants Council, planning applications within Naseby will be judged against the Neighbourhood Plan and the Local Plan.

Following an application by the Parish Council, the Naseby parish boundary has been registered by West Northants Council as the Neighbourhood Plan boundary.

An initial grant of £10,000 of Government funding has been approved which will cover the majority of the fees of consultant Yourlocale and up to £8,000 of further assistance will be also available to cover advice from external consultants on a range of technical issues.

The Parish Council selected Yourlocale as advisors because they have an extensive track record in the East Midlands of leading parishes through the



POLICE AND FIRE

I am David Brodala, the Parish Councillor with responsibility for liaison with the Police and Fire Service. On your behalf I attend a regular group from across Northamptonshire who meet with the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner Stephen Mold to make sure I am up to date with what is happening in our area and across Northamptonshire in general.

Police News

One of the first things I did was to meet with our local neighbourhood Police Officer, and for those who have not already met him, I would like to take this opportunity to introduce him to you and to tell you what help he has offered to provide for our residents.

His name is Lee Stevens, and he joined the Brixworth Neighbourhood Policing Team in October 2022 after Policing for 15 years in Central Northampton. He has a forward-thinking attitude and thoroughly enjoys the different pace of this busy area. His team of Officers and Community Support Officers has been building up numbers for the last year and is now nearly up to full strength. His aim is to address issues and concerns you have and to make all residents feel safe, to reduce crime and the fear of crime.

Lee has offered to come to the village and meet residents and would be happy to give talks to any groups on crime prevention, personal safety, neighbourhood watch and alert and any other village issues you may wish to discuss.

When we met, he particularly stressed that he would like you to report all crimes, no matter how small, as this helps him and his team to build up a picture of what is happening in the area.

At the last meeting with the Commissioner, he highlighted the work the police have been doing to reduce the number of accidents police cars have. This work has led to savings of over £750,000 per year, money that can be reinvested in other areas, meaning more cars can be on patrol as they are spending less time in the garage.



Strangely the cars with the most incidents were not, as you may think, high speed patrol cars but cars that are part of the neighbourhood police team undertaking slow manoeuvres – watch out Lee!!

As well as the Naseby team growing to full strength, the numbers of Neighbourhood Police in Northamptonshire has risen from 50 in 2016 to over 118 to date with 150 planned by the end of the year, as the Commissioner sees this as a key area to support in the future.

Fire News



Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner Stephen Mold believes Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service has now proved itself as a stable and improving organisation. The Service moved to the governance of the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner back in 2019, and although it is still the third-lowest funded Fire and Rescue Service in the country, it now has an annual budget that is almost £8million more than when the PFCC took it on four years ago.

A major focus upon first taking on the governance was also to look at areas that HMICFRS – which inspects police and fire services – had raised concerns about. By 2020, more fire appliances were regularly available to respond to incidents, and response times were improved after new scrutiny and management arrangements were put in place.

At its last inspection, His Majesty's Inspectorate of Fire and Rescue Services graded Northamptonshire as good for efficiency and effectiveness, and there are more wholetime firefighters, with an increase from 242 to 254, with regular recruitment underway to ensure that number still remains stable.

Fire News Continued...

A major programme of £10million capital investment has transformed the Service, giving firefighters modern equipment, such as wildfire backpacks on every appliance to tackle new and emerging safety risks across the county.

At the time of governance transfer, most vehicles in the fleet had reached or were reaching the end of their life. Investment has been made in eight new, next generation fire appliances, and a 42-metre turntable ladder that will improve the Service's ability to work at height.

It means that by next year, more than 40 per cent of the operational fire fleet will have been replaced.

This not only ensures firefighters have the best possible equipment to keep the county safe, but it looks to the future, with large-scale residential and commercial developments happening across Northamptonshire.

The capital programme has also invested in improving welfare and changing facilities at a host of fire stations, giving firefighters and fire staff better conditions in which to carry out their work. A review is also being undertaken to ensure the future fire estate is sustainable and more environmentally friendly.

And behind-the-scenes, significant upgrades are being made in many of the IT systems that staff use, helping to further improve efficiency and evidence-based work.

Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner, Stephen Mold, said: "When I took over governance of NFRS the aim was to get us into a position where we could stabilise our finances and then be able to invest.

"We are on a really positive journey; we've been able to replace essential equipment and recruit firefighters and modernise to meet the challenges of keeping our growing community safe into the future."

Trust your instincts - protect against scams and fraud

Scams and fraud can affect everyone – there are several ways you can protect yourself from becoming a victim of these crimes, and it is important to follow new and emerging advice as these crimes become more sophisticated and harder to spot.

We encourage you to **trust your instincts**. If something feels wrong, or you receive an unexpected message – trust your instincts and double-check. We want to raise awareness of the tactics scammers use to lure you in, and to help you spot if something doesn't look, feel, sound or seem right.

"Any of us can be caught out by scammers. They deliberately target our better natures and use psychological tactics, like being overly friendly or pretending to do you a favour, making you a limited-time offer, telling you everyone else has done something or trapping you into doing little tasks for them. If you sense something's not quite right, give a clear, firm "no" - it's ok to be firm in telling scammers you are not interested." John Hayward-Cripps, CEO of Neighbourhood Watch Network.

Action Fraud and UK Finance have shared their Take Five to Stop Fraud campaign, with three simple steps to help you avoid becoming a victim of scams...

STOP: Taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.

CHALLENGE: Could it be fake? It's ok to reject, refuse or ignore any requests.

Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.

PROTECT: Contact your bank immediately if you think you've fallen for a scam and report it to Action Fraud.

UPDATE - PLANNING APPLICATION FOR 3 LARGE WAREHOUSES - A14 JUNCTION 1 Planning Application: WND/2023/0148

This planning application is within Cold Ashby parish, close to the boundary with Naseby and is for 3 large warehouses on the site of a former landfill tip.

Other details shown on the drawings include a petrol filling station, coffee drive thru, fast food drive thru and hot food restaurant but are not part of the application. These elements received planning permission many years ago and although not constructed their permission is still valid.

Following the public meeting in the Methodist Chapel on the 4th of April, Naseby Parish Council submitted objections as also did Cold Ashby and Welford Parish Councils.

In general objections related to the lack of need for more warehouses, non-compliance with the Daventry Local Plan over locations for warehouses, the unsuitability of the site on a former landfill tip, concern over where the workforce would come from, the lack of public transport to the site, additional traffic and large vehicles adversely affecting all three parishes.

Since the objections were submitted none of the 3 parish councils has received any feedback from West Northants Council but the planning application has not progressed to a decision and no new documents have been placed on the West Northants planning website file for the 3 warehouses.

The planning position of this application will continue to be monitored.



59 / 60 BUS SERVICES TO CONTINUE IN 2024/25

West Northants Council are undertaking a comprehensive review of bus services within its area.

Both the 60 service from Naseby to Northampton which runs Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays and 59 service to Market Harborough on Tuesdays and Fridays have been classified as rural routes which require subsidy, but which are to be maintained or enhanced.

It is understood that West Northants will be including subsidy to cover the 59 and 60 routes in their overall budget for year 2024/25 which starts on 1st of April 2024.

Parishes along the routes of these services including Naseby may still have to fund part of the subsidy as they have for a number of years.


